It's been quite some time since VLAK last published a newsletter, and a lot has changed! No longer on Court Street, the VLAK office is now located in AppalReD's main building at 120 North Front Avenue in Prestonsburg. Likewise, VLAK's webpage

can now be found within AppalReD's website at www.ardfky.org. These changes have made it possible for us to better integrate our efforts into the larger mission of AppalReD—to provide access to a wide range of civil legal services to persons in eastern and south central Kentucky who would be unable to afford such assistance otherwise.

An exciting new initiative for us in providing this access is our development of pro se materials and clinics throughout our service area, initially in the area of uncontested divorces, to make our pro bono and reduced-fee attorneys available for more complex case work. We continue to partner with other legal service programs, courts and social service agencies to offer comprehensive assistance to those facing difficult challenges in navigating their day-to-day lives. VLAK Conducts Pro Se Divorce Clinic

VLAK conducted its first assisted pro se divorce clinic on August 8, 2016. The clinic, held at the Floyd County Library in Prestonsburg, offered eligible clients from Floyd, Johnson, Magoffin, Knott, Martin and Lawrence Counties who wished to pursue uncontested divorces an opportunity to do so without the need to obtain direct representation from an attorney. Clinic clients received generalized instruction on the process of filing a civil pro se case, as well as individualized assistance in completing the necessary forms. Notary publics were available on-site, and clients were instructed on how to file their completed documents with the circuit or family court clerks.

VLAK was assisted in this project by Rural Summer Law Corps Fellow Joseph Bonica, a student at the University of Mississippi School of Law. Joe did a significant amount of work researching Kentucky family law and developing informational packets on divorce and custody for the use of clients and the general public. Joe also conducted the Floyd County clinic, and developed model procedures for VLAK's future pro se clinics.

VLAK Launches National Response to Area SSD/SSI Crisis

In May of 2015, VLAK found itself facing a daunting challenge—that of finding pro bono representation for a very large number of persons who received letters from the Social Security Administration informing them that their SSD and/or SSI benefits were being reviewed, due to fraud allegedly perpetrated by attorney Eric C. Conn, four medical professionals, and an Administrative Law Judge. Those clients receiving SSD benefits were initially informed that they would lose these benefits without a hearing (an injustice later rectified). The suddenness and confusion of this announcement led directly to several suicides among clients dependent on this source of income to meet basic living expenses; that tragedy, as well as an awareness of the situation's impact on the local economy in this part of Appalachia, made it imperative that AppalReD respond immediately and effectively to this representational crisis.

With the help of the Kentucky Bar Association, the National Organization of Social Security Representatives (NOSSCR) and too many individuals to count, we were able to assemble a team of attorneys throughout the country who have now represented approximately 450 of these clients at the administrative level. More than 200 other of these clients are being represented in-house by AppalReD attorneys. We have, in the process, been pushed to develop new organizational and technological skills, including the use of Skype to facilitate communication between our clients and their volunteer attorneys. The generosity and ingenuity of these attorneys and their staffs has been boundless, and it would be impossible to adequately thank all who have been involved. They have formed something of a community among themselves, communicating information about this unique situation by way of a very effective list serve.

Most of these cases have now entered the appeals stage, including appeals to federal district court on procedural and other issues. A parallel effort to address the matter is being pursued through class action suits in KY and WV through the diligent efforts of Prestonsburg attorney Ned Pillersdorf, AppalReD's Emeritus Executive Director John Rosenberg and others.

This has been a challenging time for AppalReD, but we have learned that when a crisis presents itself, we are indeed capable of rising to the occasion and walking with the people of eastern and south-central Kentucky as they navigate this difficult situation.
