EXPUNGEMENT CLINIC

Expungement is how a record of criminal conviction is erased, destroyed or sealed from a state record. An expungement order directs the court to treat the criminal conviction as if it had never occurred, essentially removing it from a defendant's criminal record. Goodwill is focused on providing legal and financial assistance to participants because of the barriers an individual's background can have on securing stable employment, housing and other basic needs.
