March 18 at 6:50 PM Each year in Virginia, state courts order license suspensions for 300,000 to 400,000 drivers, many of them indigent, who have failed to pay court costs — fines and fees stemming from convictions. Some 900,000 suspensions were in effect last year. That means roughly a sixth of the commonwealth's motorists have lost their driving privileges because they were unwilling or, perhaps more frequently, unable to pay fines and fees.
